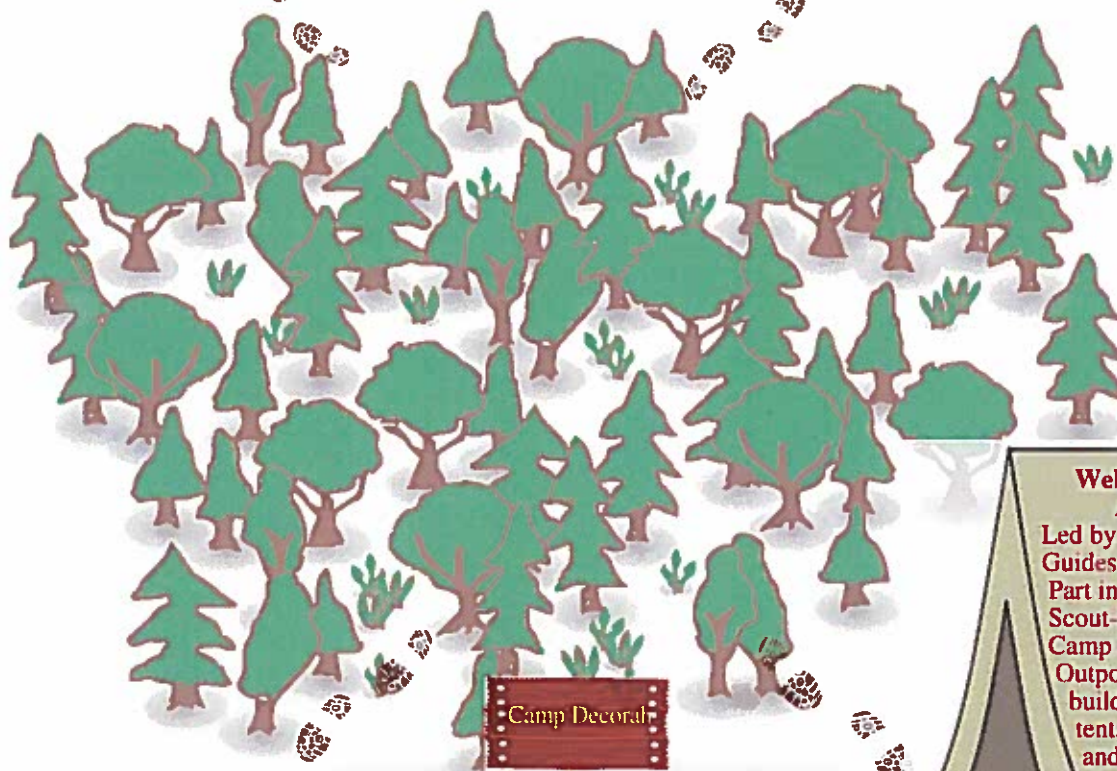

Nationally Accredited Camp: The summer camp program at Camp Decorah has been nationally accredited by the Boy Scouts of America. **What does this mean to leaders and parents?** The purpose of the Boy Scout's National Accreditation program is to help local councils elevate camps to new levels of excellence in delivering Scouting's promise to youth. The Gateway Area Council adheres to strict national camping standards that; 1) Ensures that each camper and leader has a fun, high quality program experience, 2) Ensures the health, safety and well-being of every camper, leader, visitor and staff member while participating in a BSA accredited camp.

Camp Decorah Summer Camp: Our motivated and well-trained staff look forward to introducing your Scout to a comprehensive outdoor FUN experience. Each staff member is extensively trained in his or her area of program emphasis. Trainings include; 1) Key staff member's participation in a week long National BSA Camp School in which each participant must prove proficiency in their specific area of program emphasis, 2) A week long comprehensive training for all staff members at Camp Decorah. Staff members are required to participate in all appropriate skill enhancing trainings and certification courses.

Health Officer: A certified trained Health Officer will be on-site at Camp Decorah, on call, 24 hours daily. The Health Officer is trained and certified to address all first responder incidents. Furthermore, Camp Decorah is within 10 minutes call time of medical/fire services.

Food Service and Dining: The air-conditioned dining facility "Dahl Family Center" boasts a full service commercially licensed kitchen. Our Kitchen Staff prides itself on serving delicious and nutritious meals that keep our Scouts, parents and leaders "full" until the next meal. A salad bar with other food options are available at all meals to satisfy even our "pickiest eaters". Please contact the Camp Director with any specific dietary needs. This includes food allergies or any other dietary related accommodations. The camp Health Officer will work in conjunction with the camp Cook to ensure that your dietary requirements are met to the best of our abilities.

Trading Post: Don't forget to bring spending money! The camp Trading Post can fulfill many needs. Whether it be a souvenir, a forgotten toothbrush, snack or cold drink. The Trading Post Manager will be on duty throughout the week to accommodate your needs. Make sure to check Trading Post hours upon your arrival to camp.
